Pen Computing Show in San Francisco

The second annual *PenExpo Conference and Exhibition* will be held January 25–29 at the San Francisco Hyatt. Sponsored by Boston University and *Pen Magazine*, the conference (on Tuesday–Thursday) will feature presentations by Bruce Walter, president of GRID; Jim Bartlett, head of IBM's new portable systems group; Jerrold Kaplan, chairman of GO; and our own Michael Slater. In addition, several corporate customers will describe their experiences in using pen technology in their organizations. The exhibition will include dozens of vendors with pen-based hardware and software products.
